Dear Smurf Collectors,

Welcome Back to all "True Blue" fans for this, our twelfth year! Welcome, also, to all new members who have come on board for year twelve.

Let's begin with some good news! In our last Newsletter (No. 44) we sadly reported that Irwin Toy Company would no longer be handling Smurf Products for the United States and Canada. Well, now we have good news to report, as presented to us.....

THE SMURFS GEAR UP FOR ANOTHER WAVE OF LICENSING IN THE U.S.A.

"The Smurfs are getting ready to reconquer the U.S.," says Yaffa Licensing, the U.K. arm of International Merchandising, Promotion & Services s.a. (IMPS), the Belgian owner of the property. "Several key licenses in the U.S. are lining up for the new roll out."

Yaffa Licensing is preparing the relaunch in the licensing area in the U.S. for the coming three years. Major product categories being considered are video games, online games, music releases, toys, clothing, promotional deals, and more. The Smurfs are currently broadcast on the Cartoon Network.

We will keep everyone informed as more information arrives at Club Headquarters!

Special note: No. 20448 was the figurine produced last year for the Quick Fast Food Restaurant Promotion. (See Newsletter 41, Summer 1996). For this promotion the figurine was a Super in a bath tub!

We are pleased to report more **good news for 1997!** Schleich, the manufacturer in Germany, has reissued the Super, Super No. 40603, Western Chuck Wagon. The Western Chuck Wagon was originally produced for a very brief length of time in 1985/86 for the European Market only. Wallace Berrie/Applause never had this Super, Super in their Smurf Product line!

In reference to numerous letters and inquires about the Super Super Sets over the years, please note that only the Smurfette Bedroom Set (No. 40602) and the Moonlanding Set (No. 40604) were available for a brief period in the U.S.A. from Wallace Berrie/Applause in 1985. In fact, the Moonlanding Set was produced for the U.S. market. In the Club Brochure you will note that it has a Flag that says "U.S.A." in recognition of our landing on the moon. The Smurfette Bedroom Set that was produced for the U.S. market was also distinctively different from the Bedroom Set produced for the European Market. The U.S. Bedroom Set had painted details on the furniture that the European set does not. The figurine used was the No. 20182 Smurfette with Comb and Mirror; not the Super No. 20234, Smurfette at Vanity Table. We should have both versions of this Super Super in our collections! The Gargamel Lab was produced only for the European Market!

A special "Thank You" to all who responded to this year's Club Survey. We would like to share the results with all. Voted the favorite new figurines for 1997 was:

THE DISCO PAIR

To those who have not responded to our survey as yet: Please do so. We will report more of the survey results in our next Newsletter. Of special interest will be your suggestions and ideas for new Smurf figurines. For the past two years our members have participated in submitting ideas for new figurines. This has proven to be an overwhelming success and loads of fun for all.

In 1994 my sister was in a wallpaper store looking at designs for her kitchen. What she found was Smurf Wallpaper! I immediately dragged my husband to the store and bought all they had (13 rolls). We couldn't decide where we wanted to put it so we held onto it for awhile. In October, 1995 we found out I was pregnant. Now, we knew what to do with the wallpaper. The first ultra sound showed twins! The second showed triplets! We were ecstatic. Since premature labor is the norm for multiple pregnancies we knew we had to get the room done quickly. In order to match the crib ensembles with the wallpaper, I got sheets, dust ruffles and bumpers in yellow, red and Smurf Blue. Each baby has all 3 colors on his crib. The room was finally ready. "SMURFS ARE IN CUSTODY"

April 16, 1997 Associated Press News....More than 33,000 counterfeit Plastic Smurfs from China have been confiscated in a routine customs inspection in Belgium. Belgian custom officers discovered three containers with thousands of Smurf cartoon figurines, their destination was France. They had been shipped to Antwerp, Belgium on their way to France.

Thanks to member Barry S. from New York, who provided us with a tape of the TV broadcast about this Smurfy Confiscation!

The confiscated Smurfs were not the 2" PVC figurines! They appeared to be approximately 12" to 18" high and they were all copied from the 2" PVC designs. We were able to identify the following models that were produced:

Mermaid

Gargamel with hands at his side.

Mobile Phone

Papa Santa

Bride

Smurfette with flower and purse.

Devil New Azrael Smoogle

AZIACI

Tailor

Cornucopia

Snappy

Other models may have been included in this shipment, but these are the ones that the customs agents unpacked and displayed for the TV cameras.

The TV report did state that the entire shipment would be DESTROYED!!!!!!!!!

Older 2" PVC "Pirated Smurfs"

We have been reviewing our stand on pirated (counterfeit) "Smurfs." We have always known about the numerous "Smurfs" produced by a few unauthorized manufacturers, but most have been so poorly made that we did not feel the subject warranted a special article. From time to time, however, our collectors have been alerted to the fact that the counterfeits were out there and being sold as original Smurfs. Our slogan, at these times, was "Buyer Beware."

We have now been made aware that in the early 1980's one manufacturer was producing "Smurfs" that were of excellent quality! Due to this fact, we now feel that this issue should be brought to all collectors' attention. It is not only our opinion, but that of a number of our members from whom we sought advice on this matter. Most said "Yes, write an article about the pirated (counterfeit) Smurfs! Collectors have to know how to recognize them and must know that they are on the market, especially in Europe; just like any other collectibles such as coins and stamps etc. It is important!"

And so, we now feature a line of pirated "Smurfs" that was produced, along with the poster we now show you. The poster says AQUESTS COLORS! The full color poster was produced on glossy white paper and measures 9 1/2" by 13"; the flowing banner is gold and red. The Smurf wears a red hat! His uniform shirt is red and navy blue, his shorts are navy blue. His skin is blue; his shoes are light brown. We must admit even the poster is nicely done!

continued.....2" PVC Pirated Smurfs

The most important things to look for on a PVC Smurf figurine, whether it be of good-to-excellent quality, or poor quality, are the copyright markings. "Peyo" must be found somewhere on the figurine (or any other Smurfy Product for that matter). Most of the figurines listed below are a tiny bit shorter than the licensed Smurf figurines and do not have the "Peyo" marking!

The following have been verified in what we will call the Aquests Line. We are also noting the major paint color changes on the figurines that we have seen and verified. Some we have not seen, but will list them anyway, so you will be aware of the fact that pirated "Smurfs" for these designs have been produced.

- 20001 Papa: Pale red injected mold.
- 20002 Normal: Painted as 20007 Angry! Black Smurf with all of Angry's facial features!
- 20023 Rock n Roll: Orange/red guitar w/orange strings.
- 20024 Watchman: Lantern has red top & bottom, but interior color is peach instead of yellow.
- 20030 Torchbearer: Flame on torch is orange with red details.
- 20034 Smurfette: Different mold. Both hands held out to her sides; hair is long, full and a gold/orange color.
- 20037 Doctor: Needle has black lines; black lines circle instrument on his hat.
- 20039 Mallet: no noticeable differences.
- 20042 Chef: Spoon is yellow/gold with red food.
- 20044 Lover: Flowers are notably smaller, light red, and stems are light green.
- 20045 Artist: Tip of paint brush is painted red; palette colors vary.
- 20051 Bowler: Light red bowling ball (color is similar to that of the licensed figurine).
- 20053 Ice Lolly: Ice lolly is painted white, red and yellow.
- 20054 First Aid: Orange first aid kit (no cross).
- 20058 Champion: Unknown.
- 20060 Candle: Orange candle tip.
- 20063 Tailor: Fabric on lap is a dark orange shade w/black details, black thread.
- 20064 Toothbrush: Unknown.
- 20068 Football Player: Red shirt, black pants.
- 20069 Jungle: Dull orange mold.
- 20073 Cook: Unknown
- 20076 Courting: Red center on flower.
- 20078 Beer: Unknown
- 20079 Jolly: Same as licensed figure!
- 20081 Tyrolese: Orange feather and pipe. Same colors as the Bully figurines.
- 20082 Shy: Same as licensed figure.

- 20083 Hammer: Same as licensed figure.
- 20092 Conductor: Dull red hat and pants, orange baton.
- 20093 Tennis Player 2: Unknown.
- 20095 Oboist: Orange/gold oboe with black holes.
- 20095 Oboist: Orange oboe with black holes.
- 20097 Injured: Light brown cane and cross on hat.
- 20098 Ballerina: Smaller lime green round base.
- 20099 Headcook: Yellow/gold bow tie and rolling pin.
- 20102 Archer: Gold bow, red feather in cap, two red arrows, one piece mold.
- 20103 Scholar: Black straps on bag.
- 20104 Pirate: Same as licensed figure.
- 20106 Hunter: Black gun, red feather in hat (bird's beak is not red).
- 20108 Sauna: Brush is bright yellow.
- 20110 Hairdresser: Same as licensed figure.
- 20111 Cupid: Unknown.
- 20112 Carpenter: Saw is black.
- 20120 Frogman: Red frogman suit, gold snorkel.
- 20121 Ice Skater: Red/orange scarf, orange gloves.
- 20123 Policeman: White European uniform (no notable differences in color).
- 20124 Santa: Brown sack over shoulder, black belt.
- 20126 Rollerskater: Black stoppers on skates.
- 20128 Amour: Silver arrow through heart.
- 20129 Baseball Batter: No noticeable differences.
- 20131 French Fries: Fries are in a red bag.
- 20132 American Football: Unknown.
- 20134 Judo: Red belt.
- 20135 Tennis Smurfette: Red socks, green base.
- 20139 Nurse: Orange hair, white dress and apron; needle has black details.
- 20144 Indian: White pants, brown shoes, pastel feathers.

Please remember that the figurines listed above are all of excellent quality and paint, but have no markings whatsoever!

Numerous other pirated figurines have been produced in different countries, but they are mostly crude, poorly made and poorly painted. You can spot such "Smurfs" in a second and we hope don't have to be made aware of.

News Release.....

Bullyland, manufacturers of PVC figurines, is planning a celebration for their 25th Anniversary on June 26, 1998, at their headquarters in Spraitbach, Germany. It has been reported to us that the festival will have something for people of all ages. June is a wonderful time to visit Germany, so make your plans early and take advantage of this rare opportunity to see one of the first companies to produce PVC figurines and to tour their extensive collection of cartoon characters, including our beloved Smurfs. Spraitbach, Germany, is located near Stuttgart!

BULLY

The Company History.....

Established in 1973 by Volkmar Klaus in a small garage in Spraitbach, Germany, a village near Stuttgart. Mr. Klaus chose the French Bulldog as his company trademark because he breeds and loves them. Over the years he became known throughout the world as "Mr. Bully!"

We have seen printed material from Bullyland in which they claim to have "Brought Smurfs to the World." It was not until 1974 however, that Bully produced Smurfs! Many European collectors call the Bully figurines "The Original Smurfs" but, indeed, they are not! Let us remember that Schleich has been producing Smurf figurines since 1965!

In 1977 Bully opened a modern administration building and warehouse in Spraitbach. In 1978, Mr. Klaus opened a new production plant in Ronsberg/Bovaria with highly specialized in-house tooling and construction departments, a production department with 20 injection machines, an in-house art department and a highly qualified technical staff.

In 1978/79 a lawsuit was brought by "Peyo" against Bully, to terminate his contract with them to produce Smurf figurines. Bully had the exclusive sales of the Smurfs in the Federal Republic of Germany (West Germany), the Scandinavian countries and in Canada. The first court battle round was lost by "Peyo" and "Bully" did receive compensation.

In the meantime, Schleich was continuing production of Smurfs for many other European countries and also started production for the U.S.A., Japan, Australia and South Africa where there was, in all cases, tremendous demand for these little blue cartoon characters.

There ensued a complicated court battle between "Peyo," "Mr. Bully" and Schleich. The end result below......

The following Press Report appeared in West German newspapers from Schleich:

The contracts between the creator of the Smurfs ("Peyo") and the competitor of Schleich (Bully) expire on December 31, 1979. After that date Schleich will be the worldwide distributor, according to the wish of "Peyo." Schleich will be the sole manufacturer and seller of the PVC Smurf figurines. The court of Brussels (Belgium) has held that these Smurf products were pioneered by Schleich! Schleich has made Smurf PVC figurines since 1965!

The Smurf Disco is wearing an orange shirt with white collar. His pants are royal blue with a yellow belt. His shoes are grey and white.

The Smurfette Disco has a large pink bow in her hair. Her blouse is pink and her skirt is orange with light green stars. Her shoes are white.

PAPA SEA CAPTAIN

His hat is red with a white hat band and black brim. His jacket is white with yellow buttons. His pants and feet are red. The telescope is yellow.

SMURFETTE ON BEACH TOWEL

This magnet is delightfully different! She wears a red star on her hat. Her hair is long, full and flowing as is the Disco Smurfette's. She wears a bright pink bathing suit and sits on a lime green towel with yellow trim.



BABY WITH TEDDY BEAR

Baby is wearing Pink! The teddy bear is light brown with white around his mouth, belly and bottom of his paws. His bow tie is navy blue.

SAXOPHONE SMURF

This musical Smurf is a favorite! His shirt is bright yellow, his pants are green and he's wearing light and dark blue shoes. The saxophone is a bright gold/yellow.

SMURF MINI MATES

There are 12 different Mini Mates, as featured in the photo below. The figurines and their accessories are plastic.
