Dear Smurf Collectors,

Summer of 1997 was only a moderately good season for Smurf collectors seeking Smurf items at garage sales, flea markets, toy shows, etc. Information received from members in the U.S. and overseas indicates only a fair amount of success in Smurf hunts. It has been noted that older items dating back to the 60s, 70s, and 80s are, apparently, disappearing from the scene. Members' reports also show that prices on some older and hard-to-find items are higher than in previous years. Some collectors have reported that items from the Irwin line of Smurf products, produced last year, are being found but only in very limited quantities.

STANLEY DESANTIS PAVES THE WAY

FOR TRENDY APPAREL LICENSES

According to Stanley DeSantis, president of Stanley DeSantis, Inc., everything that was cool when he was a kid is just as cool today. That is why the portfolio of properties he works with are appealing.

These licenses include Scooby Doo, George of the Jungle, The Jetsons, Lost in Space, and The Smurfs, to name only a few. Stanley DeSantis, Inc. will showcase these and other properties, including Beavis and Butt-head, The X-Files, Starship Troopers. King Of The Hill, Spawn, Tamagotchi, and Davey and Goliath at this season's Magic show in Las Vegas. The show provides licensors and buyers the opportunity to see DeSantis's array of properties. DeSantis points out that the show is not so much about writing orders but presenting his line. "Magic is like a fashion show; people see the line, make notes, and then we work with the salesperson later," he says DeSantis says he is proud of the ing at Magic, because it repreself on the line, but when there is a win, the win is big, because you were the first," he notes.

DeSantis points to Davey and Goliath as an oddball license he wanted to showcase. Based on a claymation series which aired a few decades ago, Davey and Goliath has been successful for DeSantis at the "really hip rock and roll stores," "We had to track down who owned it for months and finally found out it belonged to the Lutheran church," he adds.

The Smurfs is another property DeSantis is proud to have in his collection. He says he has always thought the Smurfs were funny, and he likes the messages these good-hearted, oddlooking creatures are putting out: friendship and bonding DeSantis also notes that because these little people are blue, they appeal to all races DeSantis says Smurf products appeal to kids watching the cartoon on the Cartoon Network. as well as to teenagers and twenty-somethings who like The Smurfs' retro attributes.

Along with setting trends in the industry with new licenses. Stanley DeSantis, Inc. looks for properties that will sell for long



sents what DeSantis wants his company to do—avoid jumping on the bandwagon.

"Our strong suit is the vision we have in picking interesting properties, not just the next by movie." DeSantis says. "I will not be one of the five licensees of a new movie coming out. Get me away!" In fact, DeSantis credits his company as a source for trends as opposed to a follower of them. He says people in the industry look to his company for ideas and to him dout what is new. "It is shessful because you put your

periods of time. For example, Beavis and Butt-head, which the company has licensed for five years, is still successful at retail today. DeSantis says that properties like the Simpsons-Scoolsy-Doo. The X-Files, and King Of The Hill have also sold consistently this summer, even though retail has been a bit soft. Here is the second part of MY STORY!.....

How to become a knowing Smurf Collector.

Like I wrote last time, you have to start early with collecting things. If you have to get in after a few years things are hard to get, expensive and not in mint condition anymore.


When I was 12 years old my parents, my brother and I went to France on holiday. Nice Country! In 1972 lots of stores sold Smurfs. I saw several Smurfs in new colors and took them with me, they were real expensive those days (about \$10) but I thought better a rare one expensive in my collection as not in my collection at all! Every store I went (not only toy stores, but also bookstores, souvenir stores etc.) sold Smurfs. I bought for \$100, Smurfs!! All of the pocket money I had saved for the holidays was gone.

The next year I went to England (London) and it started all over again! Found several Smurfs I had never seen before. Shopping...collecting...what fun.

Then I came back to Amsterdam and found a shop where the owner was a collector himself. He imported Smurfs from the USA, they looked different to me and I spent all my money once again on them. I later find out that was good, I now don't need much different Wallace Berrie Smurfs. Then I knew all the different colors I had in my collection! This shop closed in 1979 when I was 19 and I have never found another store who was a specialist in Smurfs like this one.

Later I got me a girlfriend and got married. We made several trips through Europe to Spain, France Germany, Italy, Suisse, Belgium, NY (U.S.A.) and more and everytime we saw a toystore we had to get in and almost everytime I get out with Smurfs in a bag! Looking for Smurfs can be easy, you only have to know which ones you have. I had made photo's from my collection, at that time (1980-1981) and I had then 250 Smurfs in my collection.

When we went to Spain in 1980 or 1981 I saw several Smurfs with Traffic Signs and several Smurfs holding things I did never see in the Netherlands! I took them with me and thought it was a nice upgrade for my collection. All the Smurfs were #40208 Signbearer Smurf holding these different things a ladder, a pacifier, a spear and other things I cannot translate. (Newsletter #3) for all the details. I do add to that article that eight Traffic Signs were produced, as shown below, not just the seven shown in past Newsletter.



We love to hear about these unusual items! We have to admit this is another "First" as we have never heard of a blank Smurf-A-Gram before this. It sounds to us as if it, very possibly, could be a factory error. Very unique to say the least. We would also like to say that very few Super Smurfs were ever produced as Smurf-A-Grams. To date we have only heard of the Signbearer Super Smurf, the Cyclist Super Smurf and the Chimney Sweep Super Smurf, as being used for that purpose. All other Smurf-A-Grams were produced with regular 2" Smurf figurines; not Supers with accessories.

Dear Bruce and All Members,


We receive numerous letters on this subject every year and although we answer each letter individually, we do feel that it's time this information should appear in our Newsletter as more and more of our collectors are asking about the Entex Smurfs.

In 1982 the Entex Toy Company produced four different Loc Blocs Sets. These sets are similar to Lego Bloc sets. The sets consisted of basic building blocks, a base plate, plus a vinyl-molded Smurf Character.

The four sets were:

- 1, #1475 Dr. Smurf's Office
- 2. #1476 Papa Smurfs Lab
- 3. #1477 Smurf House
- 4. #1479 Gargamel's Castle

Below is a photo of two of these sets.



Special Note to All Members:

Along the same line as the numerous questions about the Entex Figurines, we also receive many questions about what, many are told, is a VERY RARE SMURF. In this case we are referring to letters received at Club Headquarters telling us about these Smurfs in all different colors: Red, Yellow, Purple, Green, Orange, etc. They bear the marking EMPIRE and usually the date of 1978.

We have discussed this in previous Newsletters, but inquiries are still being made so we wish to alert all our members once again.

Although these bear a resemblance to Smurfs, THEY ARE NOT SMURFS, but what the Empire Toy Company referred to as GNOMES!

Please refer to the photos below and remember they were produced in many different colors. However to the best of our knowledge, none were ever produced with blue faces or bodies. They also all had pompons on their hats and shoes; their hats were very different from the Smurf Hats.



Dear Suzanne,


You said to let you know how Smurfing went in France on our vacation. Smurfs must still have considerable popularity in France. Many hard-covered books about Smurfs and Smurflings were available in French. PVC 2" figurines were also available - mainly the newer ones (no rare or unusual finds). There were no Smurf promotions going on in the Quick Restaurants.

Galleries Lafayette, a large department store in Paris, had many Smurf items. Outside the store vendors were selling large cylinders that children could bounce. These were of various colors with Smurf pictures on them. At rest stops we found Kinder Eggs for sale. Some boxes containing the eggs pictured a Smurf as well as other cartoon characters; some did not.

When we took a funicular train up into the Pyrenees Mountains, we stopped at a restaurant/shop just over the border between France and Spain. There they had a mechanical ride for children in the shape of a Smurf in a boat.

We spent part of an afternoon shopping in Bordeaux, we wandered into a card shop. In a locked case in the back they had many collectibles. I spotted a group of tiny pins. Two were of a Smurf lying on their backs. They are small, but well-painted and would make a nice tie tac or a pin for a lapel collar.

As we examined the contents of the showcase further we discovered an adorable chess set. I've included some pictures. The "white" pieces are blue Smurfs and the "black" pieces are black Smurfs. We were impressed by the craftsmanship, but a bit shocked at the high price of the set. The clerk (who did not speak English) showed us the certificate that accompanied it. We hope we were right in assuming this is a limited edition and we made a good investment in purchasing it. The set was mentioned in our Spring '97 Newsletter.







Nestle's Chocolate jump starts the U.S. Market with toys inside a Chocolate Egg.....Will Ferrero (Kinder Eggs) follow their lead? See the article below:

Toys in Candy Arouse Fears

Washington — Nestle's gambit to put Disney toys like Hercules inside a new chocolate candy has the government regulators scrambling to write new food safety rules for what could become a big new trend.

Federal health officials said yesterday that the Disney figures hidden inside Nestle Magic balls of chocolate appear safe — they're too big to choke someone and are encased in a plastic shell not expected to chip teeth.

But no one has ever sold toys actually inserted into food in this country, and the fear is that as Nestle Magic hits the shelf this week, competitors may rush to produce candies that are a threat.

"We'd be very, very concerned about the safety aspects of this kind of product," said Terry Troxell of the Food and Drug Administration, which is writing new regulations to set federal safety standards for candy-covered toys.

And the Consumer Product Safety Commission, anticipating Nestle's gambit will start a trend, is writing chocolate manufacturers to warn that such confections will be strictly scrutinized, said spokeswoman Jane Francis.

Nestle, meanwhile, hopes to persuade kids and moms that its new candy is a good deal because you get a treat within a treat. Its first nationwide shipments this week contain 24 figures from recent Disney movies, including "101 Dalmatians" and "Hercules.

"We just felt it was a fantastic opportunity to have a product that has some fun and surprise elements to it," said Nestle Vice President Laurie MacDonald. She called the candy a "magic ball" that kids eat section by section until they pull the plastic shell from the center and reveal the toy.

A Nestle competitor has sold 2 billion candy-covered toys in Europe. But until now, no company has tried to sell such food here. Nestle approached the consumer safety agency in March to say it had tested the Magic candies against all CPSC's child-safety standards for toys and they had passed. The toy-containing shell, for instance, is almost 2 inches in diameter, above CPSC standards to prevent choking.

Then last month, Nestle petitioned the FDA to allow the product.

The first Kinders were sold 20 years ago in Italy. Soon Germany and the rest of Europe followed.

Now **Kinders** are the largest-sold children's toy in the world. Daily around 2.5 million such toys are produced in Italy, Germany and China - that means about 1.2 billion a year!!!! They are available in Europe, South American, Canada, Asia, Australia, but **not in the U.S.A. and Africa.**

One hundred and thirty to one hundred and sixty different Kinder toys are produced each year. Nobody (or almost nobody) knows how many were produced since they started - but probably about 3,000 different ones.

The article "Toys in Candy Arouse Fears" was published in July, 1997. We followed this very closely and it did not take long, as we anticipated, for someone to attempt to import the European Ferrero Kinder Eggs.

Below is the follow-up article from Associated Press:

A Chicago company recalled 5,000 German chocolate eggs yesterday because the government determined that they pose a serious risk to young children who may choke on toy figures hidden inside. The Consumer Product Safety Commission advised parents who have bought Kinder Surprise chocolate eggs to take the toys away from children under 3 years of age. The toys come in pieces that children are supposed to fit together and the CPSC said the pieces are so small that, if put in their mouth, they could easily cause young children to choke. The chocolate eggs are about the size of a large hen's egg in an orange, white and blue foil

wrapper and can be recognized by the name "Kinder Surprise" and labeling in German and other languages. The toy is contained in an oval egg-shaped plastic capsule inside is a chocolate shell. Ferrero Group manufacturers and sells it "Kinder Surprises" in Europe. The CPSC and Ferrero did not know the eggs were imported into the U.S., where the government declared them illegal because of the choking risk. Kreiner Imports of Chicago imported the eggs, the CPSC said. Kreiner could not immediately be reached for comment, but the government said the company agreed to voluntarily recall the eggs.

Candy giant Nestle last month, began selling a chocolate wrapped toy ball with figures of Disney movie characters inside, but the government has determined that the Nestle Magic toys are safe, large enough that they did not pose a choking hazard. Still the FDA says Nestle's move opened the door to competitors that may be a threat, and the agency is racing to write new safety standards for such candies. The Kinder eggs are the first candy-covered toy discovered to be a threat since this type of food debut in this country.

2 States Seek Nestle Recall Of Candy Item

Minneapolis — The attorneys general from Connecticut and Minnesota yesterday urged Nestle to voluntarily remove from store shelves new chocolate candy balls with Disney movie figures inside because they say the "Nestle Magic" candy poses a health threat to anyone who eats it.

"This illegal product literally sugarcoats potential death and injury — wrapping in chocolate small toys that may cause choking or worse," said Connecticut Attorney General Richard Blumenthal. Minnesota Attorney General Hubert Humphrey contended that the product violates federal and state food safety laws.

Nestle won't recall the item, and spokeswoman Laurie MacDonald said the balls pose no danger to anyone. The company agreed to add to the label that they are intended for children who are at least 3.

To All Members: This is not a new issue for us. We have been following the Kinder Egg Smurfs since we first learned of them back in the early 80s. In conclusion, these articles are "Proof Positive" that we will never see Kinder Egg Smurfs in the U.S.A. The only hope we have is if Ferrero decides to make their toys larger to meet CPSC standards.

We have also received a number of inquiries from our collectors in Canada wanting to know why the Maxi Kinders Egg Smurf items we have featured, are no longer in their country. The information given to us is that the cost of having the Maxis shipped to Ferrero Canada is much more than they want to incur. Also, many of the eggs get damaged in transit since they are large and bulky, Chances are, we have been told, the Maxis will never be available in Canada again. This is probably true for Australia as well.

From Germany.....

The Smurfs are on tour, in Germany, appearing in their very own Smurf Shows. Techno Smurf (referred to as DJ Smurf) and the Inline Skater Smurf appear in life-sized costumes.

The Smurfs also now appear under a circus tent in Germany!!!!

The shows have been touring since mid February and has been an extraordinary success with over 100,000 spectators. The tour is now scheduled to run until March 1998.

We would like to thank a very special friend of one of our members for the following translations from German to English. This translation has not been edited. See below:

The first "smurfical" in the world

The smurfs just love their cheerful small toadstool village. Nothing or nobody can make them leave their smurfland voluntarily but you have to know that every year grandfather Smurf gets a travel fever on his birthday. The only medicine, a travel to the human country, is not given him for a real long time. To fulfil this dream, the eldest smurf needs the help of a small child.

But what kind of help this is, cannot be given away but most certain is that grandfather Smurf's wish will come true. The smurfs are on their way to the human country - and their adventure can be experienced by children and adults directly.

Together with S-Cord Konzertburo GmbH - as exclusive partner of the Peyo-representatives I.M.P.S. and AT&TV - the smufs created a very special show on stage.

Together with experienced professionals a show has been created which can be described as a combination between a fairy-tale and a musical. Imaginative light and sound effects and numerous technical play ideas cause a magical atmosphere and carried the audience away.

But the most import part in this play does not belong to the smurfs but the many small and large spectators. To play and sing along is not only permitted but even more urgently requested.

It was exactly 77 smurfyears ago since a child could break the magic ban and grandfather Smurf came to the human beings. A smurf birthday travel is a very special occasion and it can only happen when you wish very strongly for the small blue fellows. It can happen like Tommy, the "human" principal figure of the so called musical, and on a certain night grandfather Smurf will stand in your room.

But you have to see this story by yourself... so many is told yet: with the smurfs it will take you even further away. Because with a magic powder grandfather Smurf will manage to get the whole cheerful chaotic smurf family in the human country. But Gargamel and his cat Azrael will wait for them in the smurf circus. Like always, the magician tries to catch the smurfs and this time he made up a very special trick: we won't betray no more!

On an "Extraklasse" smurf party, where also the new smurfs (the DJ-smurf and the Inline smurf) will walk in a large size, their favourite songs were presented and they danced like they never did before.

Of course you are invited to this giant party. The smurfs just look forward to seeing you.....

The smurfs without their smurf country, that would be a snail without a shell: absolutely unthinkable.

But how can you take 149.337 m3 smurfland on your travel. Very simple, you roll it up, fold it together, load it on 14 trucks and drive from town to town. Do you believe this can happen? Furthermore it is amazing what they all hide under the dome of the main tent. Every day, about 2.000 spectators have themselves carried away. The "30th Anniversary Smurf' is 1 3/4" in height and stands on a gold square stand. The stand has "30th," with a wreath around it in black. The total height of the Smurf and the stand is 2 1/2" just slightly taller than a regular Smurf figurine. On the bottom, the markings are "Peyo" 1988 Licensed through IMPS (Brussels)
