

But she did say that it saddened her because she was told by Nestle that they had to recall them because of the choking issue.

## Nestle to Pull Candies With Disney Toys

**A**FTER PRESSURE from state attorneys general and intense negotiations with the Food and Drug Administration, Nestle USA announced yesterday it will pull off the market chocolate candies with Disney toys hidden inside.

Nestle insisted the Nestle Magic candies were safe. And the Consumer Product Safety Commission had certified that the Disney movie figures like Hercules — inside a plastic ball covered in chocolate — were too big to choke a child.

The FDA confirmed that it knew of no injuries associated with Nestle Magic. Nestle did not recall the chocolates, but anyone who wants to return them to the store where they were purchased will be given a refund, a company spokeswoman said.

Critics said the withdrawal was overdue. "Some of the toys barely, and I mean by a fraction of a little toe, pass the standard choke test," said Connecticut Attorney General Richard Blumenthal.

We are sorry to say, that this serves as "Proof Positive" that we will never see Kinder Egg Smurfs in the U.S.A. To our Canadian collectors we are pleased to announce that the 1996/97 series, featured in Newsletter #43, is now available in your country!

Editors Desk continued.....

Since the inception of the Club in 1986, we have received hundreds of letters asking how to display 2" PVC figurines. Some of our collectors were concerned that their figurines would become discolored by the elements, etc. Some wanted to display their figurines yet, at the same time, keep them clean and dust-free. Others wanted a display that would keep their figurines safe from the sticky hands of admiring little children, etc., etc., etc.

We have been investigating this for a long time and we finally have a solution that may interest you. One of the issues we had a problem with was the cost factor. Numerous manufacturers make nice cases but the cost was prohibitive.

We are now pleased to advise all S.C.C.I. members that we have made special arrangements to have a lovely Acrylic display case produced for 2" PVC figurines at an excellent **SPECIAL PRICE FOR MEMBERS ONLY. Just \$66.00 plus S&H.**

Below is a sketch of the case with measurements. As mentioned, the case is made of sturdy acrylic with a beautiful mirror back; front cover has closing latches. This will keep our figurines clean and dust-free! I have experimented here at Club Headquarters and feel that each case will hold approximately 300 Smurf figurines without crowding. In some instances, many more when we consider that some of the earlier Smurfs were quite small in their width. In other words, each case will hold, comfortably, 300+ regular 2" figurines.

### Collectors Comments.....

Dear Suzanne,

I was an avid Pez Collector before I got hooked on collecting Smurfs and I was pleased to see in our Newsletter that two new Smurf Pez will be produced, Brainy and Gargamel.

I thought I would pass on a bit of information about Smurf Pez and all Pez for that matter! Seems there are a lot of questions in the Pez collecting field about which Pez are old and which are the current ones. The best way for me to tell is by the patent number. All of the current Pez that you can buy are #4,966,305; the older ones or original issues are #3,942,683 or lower. So, for instance, if a Pez is reissued it will have a 4,9 number and may be a variation. A 3,9 number is original. A good example of this is the Smurfette Pez. She was reissued with a 4,9 number and she is a variation with a **yellow stem**. The stem color, in this case, is the variation. Another great variation with a 3,9 number is the Papa Smurf Pez with a **white hat**! This must have been a factory error, cause Papa always has a red hat. I also have another Smurf Pez variation. The regular Smurf with feet (don't forget Pez are produced both with feet and without) both 3,9 white stem without tongue and the other on red stem with tongue.

Also, you will find different country markings on the Pez, just as on the Smurf figures. Example: Austria, Yugoslavia, China etc.

I just thought our members would enjoy hearing about **Smurf Pez Variations**. **The New Pez are available in Europe!! Gargamel has a BLACK STEM!!!! They are just appearing 12/97!!!!**


They appear to be a top of something as they have notches in the round base, and the underside has a plastic insert with a peg.

I was given a Gnome and told that it was a rare Smurf. I also happened to see a picture of the Gnomes in a book about fast-food collectibles. They were pictured with the Smurfs, so I wondered if they were related. I looked at the bottom and found Empire on it, so I became confused. I remember the Smurfs very well, but these Gnomes are completely new to me. Thanks for clearing this up for me!

I enjoyed reading the list of members' suggestions and ideas for new Smurfs. I especially liked these: Four Smurflings riding on Puppy, Super Smurf Space Shuttle w/Smurfette, Papa Smurf as Uncle Sam, Smurf holding a world globe (I think this would be good for Brainy Smurf), Smurfette Angel, Smurf as a ghost, Father Time and Mother Nature, Gargamel holding a tiny Smurf in hand, and more Limited Editions. I read with a great deal of interest in our last Newsletter about the **Empire Toy Company Gnomes**.

As I collect hundreds of different PVC figurines from numerous manufacturers, I am well aware of this line of figurines and thought other members might be interested in knowing more about them. Especially due to the fact that most dealers who advertise these for sale, do as you said. They say they are very **rare Smurfs!** As you mentioned previously, none were ever produced with blue skin. The ones in my collection have orange, yellow and green skin. Their hats and pants are usually green, red, purple, etc.

It is my opinion that these were based on the Smurf idea when first produced in 1978. All of the figurines I have in this Gnome Family are copied from the early Smurf figures such as:

Laughing

Playing Trumpet

Ice Lolly

Sleepwalker

Tennis

Naughty

Beer Mug

Normal

Jolly

There was also one female gnome with long blonde hair, very similar to our Smurfette. Below is a photo of the blister package they came in. Although the back of the packaging says "Collect 'Em All Over 100 Different Gnomes!" I have never found there to be 100 different poses. Perhaps they produced each pose in a variety of different color combinations and that is why they say there are 100 different ones.

Also of special interest, as you can see by the packaging below, the Gnomes did not live in Mushroom Houses but in little tree houses.



UPDATE.....

In Newsletter 37, Summer 1995 and Newsletter 44, Spring 1997 we reported on a candy product being produced by BIP, Holland. These are candy tubes with M & M type candies.



We received many letters from our members about these candy tube products when they appeared on the market, but it was not until we located them just recently, that our interest in the product was peaked.

We at Club Headquarters adore them! The most exciting item to be produced other than new 2" Smurf figurines by Schleich. We think they are better than the Super Smurfs, as each Candy Topper is a complete scene itself! They are made of a hard rubber, and bear their date of production. They are produced in beautiful bright colors with great detailing! They are about 3 1/2" in height. We believe that they have been produced for three years 1995, 1996, and 1997.

We have not seen the complete line, but we will list and describe the ones that we have.

#### 1995 SERIES

- Smurf Clown w/drum** - An adorable clown with a bright red nose. He is beating on a large drum. Sitting atop the drum is a cute little brown bird.
- Smurf Jack in the Box** - Popping out of a yellow box decorated with red stars is a Smurf clown head on top of a red and green spring. The clown head has his fingers in his ears and his tongue sticking out. He has a bright red nose and a ruffled white collar around his neck.
- Gargamel & Azrael** - Standing on a green grass base in all their glory! Azrael's tail curls up along Gargamel's black coat. Gargamel's nose is a half-inch in length alone. In his left hand he carries a yellow bucket with a tiny Smurf trapped in it, face and hands peeking up out of the bucket.



**Three Smurfs Dancing Around the Christmas Tree** - A lovely lime- green Christmas Tree stands on a dark green round base. The tree is decorated with red streamers, orange and pink balls and orange candles. Three Smurfs join hands and dance around the tree. The little Smurfs are about 1 1/2" in height.

**Papa as Santa** - This design is familiar to us all. It has been used on Calendars, store displays etc. Papa is dressed as Santa. He is walking on a base of snow and carrying a lime green toy bag over his shoulder filled with Xmas gifts. In his other hand he is carrying a red and orange lantern.

**Mushroom Cottage Winter Scene** - Two Smurfs sitting on the roof of a snow- covered Mushroom cottage stringing Christmas decorations on the roof. One of the Smurfs is standing on a ladder. The cottage is bright yellow with a red roof ( where snow doesn't cover it.) The front door is decorated with a Christmas Wreath.

**Vanity & Smurfette Riding on a Turtle** - Apparently love is in bloom for these two Smurfs! They are riding on the back of a two- tone green turtle. Vanity is sitting to Smurfette's left and they are back- to- back. Vanity appears to be love- sick and Smurfette, with her legs crossed, is in an amorous pose, holding a large bouquet of beautiful flowers.




### 1996 SERIES

**Baby Smurf Riding Atop Crawling Papa's Back** - Papa Smurf is down on all fours with Baby riding on his back. Baby is in Pink P.J.s holding a toy in its hand. Papa has a grin on his face that tells one and all how much he is enjoying this little playful act.

**Smurf Roving Reporter** - This Smurf appears to be of the New Generation. He is bending on one knee, ready to take a photo. He has a camera in his hand, a huge yellow backpack on his back and sunglasses atop his hat. He is wearing bright pink shorts with white stars.

**Inline Skater Smurfette** - This Smurfette is also of the New Generation. She is sitting on what appears to be a brown tree stump. She has her inline skates on with a walkman radio and ear phones on her head. She is wearing a bright green skirt and skate boots with a white blouse. Her bright yellow hair is long and flowing!

**Magician Smurf** - This Smurf is rather unique! He is standing with a black top hat with a brown bird popping out of it. His pants and hat are navy blue with yellow stars. His cape is yellow with blue stars. One finger of his hand is pointing upward as if he is prepared to make the bird disappear.



### 1997 Series

**Papa Santa and Three Smurfs Dancing Around the Christmas Tree** are reissued for the 1997 Series.

**Smurf Building Snowman** - This topper is a 3 1/2" snowman with a black top hat, red scarf around its neck, carrot nose and mouth and blue eyes. He also has a broom in his hand. Leaning on the snowman, smoothing his "snow," is a little Smurf 1 3/4" in height wearing lime-green earmuffs and a red scarf.

**Smurf & Smurfette Riding Sled** - Atop a mound of snow rides Smurf on a sled with Smurfette sitting on his back. They are going downhill! They are both wearing **stocking hats with pom-poms!!** This is a very colorful scene. The Smurf is dressed in two shades of green/ yellow and red. He is wearing black snow goggles. Smurfette is attired in a bright pink outfit with white trim. She is wearing lime green earmuffs over her hat.

### NO SERIES DATE

**Papa Smurf Asleep Under a Mushroom** - Papa leaning on one elbow, legs crossed, appears to sound asleep under a large mushroom. Of course, the mushroom top is red and white. Sitting atop the mushroom is a light brown squirrel.

### Smurf Party Punch Dispenser !!!!!


It is always of great interest when a member locates an item that we have not seen or heard about previously. We welcome this information so it can be shared with our members. If the information comes with photographs, photocopies, etc., all the better! Any photo we feel, is better than none at all. One photo as the saying goes, is worth a thousand words.

In Newsletter 32, Spring 1994, a member shared with us his Hardee's Glasses Cardboard Display from 1983.

It now appears that at the same time, when Hardee's Fast Food Restaurant was promoting the oh so popular Smurf Drinking glasses, they also had a **Smurf Party Punch Dispenser**.

The dispenser was produced by Rubbermaid Commercial Products Inc.; it is a three gallon plastic dispenser with spout. The Smurf Scene Decal was licensed by "Peyo" Wallace Berrie, 1983, S E P P Dm. Int. The scene appears on both sides of the drink dispenser and features Papa Smurf, Smurf, Smurfette and the Hardee's Harmony Glass in beautiful bright colors. The dispenser measures 14" wide, 10" high, 9" front- to- back.

**We wonder if it dispensed BLUE PUNCH!** Does anyone remember???






