Many S.C.C.I. collectors have written to express pleasure in the fact that the six new 1999 figurines were all produced and painted in Germany (at least the first run figurines have been produced in Germany). In the opinions of many, the German painting is superior to the painting that has been done in China. Whether the later figurines will be painted in China is yet to be seen. Many of the Golden 100's are being produced in China. If anyone is seeking figurines with the "China" marking please let us know. Many collectors consider origin-of-country markings to be a variation.

Please note that Smurf No. 20154, Patrol Crossing (Stop Sign) has been reissued as one of the "Golden 100s" for 1999. This Smurf will be of particular interest to those of us who collect mold variations! In the early 1990s new child- safety laws forced the discontinuation of Smurf No. 20154, as well as all other Smurf figurines made with separate, removable, parts. Casualties of the child-safety law, just to name a few: Papa with Pizza, Gargamel with Net, Smurfette with Ice Cream, Traffic Smurf, Heart Smurf, Surprise Bag Smurfs etc. etc. In accordance with the new rules our friend, Patrol Crossing Smurf, has been redesigned. Any members interested in adding this newly designed figurine to your collections must let us know!

I think this is an interesting fact, as the Tourist Smurf can be documented as being designed by "Peyo" before his deat in 1992.

Tourist Smurf also appeared in the S.C.C.I. Newsletter 47, Winter 1997. He was produced as a Popular Canol Topper. I also note that it appears the Candy Topper was produced in the exact same colors as the New 2" PVC figurine.

#### Dear Club Members,

In Newsletter 50, (Fall1998) James, from the State of Washington, told us that Cartoon Candy Toppers would be the hottest collectible of the new Millennium. This information "straight from the horse's mouth" as James is employed by a company that produces this type of product in the U.S.A.

The May 1999 issue of THE TOY BOOK, a publication that serves the Global Marketplace, had a four page article on TOY CANDY. It is an extremely interesting and informative article! This new craze covers any and all toy: that include a candy product. The most famous candy toy, the PEZ CANDY DISPENSER, was introduced in 1952! Pez stood alone in the toy/candy world for many, many years.

Today, the number of manufacturers producing items in the "new" category is growing by leaps and bounds. The candy/toy category is still evolving and is creating some confusion as to what, exactly, the products are: TOYS or CANDY? Oftentimes the retailer attempts to settle the issue with his decision as to where to display them.

Manufacturers report that, just a few short years ago, pitching a combination toy/candy product to retailers was difficult. The toy retailers wanted no part of them since such items were viewed as "food" and the grocers wanted no part of them since they were viewed as "toys." Of course, it is simpler these days with the huge supermarkets and pharmacies that have specialty toy, candy and gift departments. Even large toy stores now have candy departments! Problem solved!

Toy candy is an exciting category in the eyes of collectors! After reading the article on the subject, I can only hope that IMPS gets more involved with the Smurf Toy Candy industry, even if only in Europe. I am sure these items will cross the ocean to find us in the U.S.A.!

#### Smurfs Used In The 1980's For Fire Safety Promotion

Tragic hotel fire deaths prompted a San Antonio man to develop, with the help of his wife and his mother a simple product he expects will save lives while making him a lot of money.

Robert Smallwood said he sees a strong market for his fire exit signs that glow in the dark without benefit of electricity. The phosphorescent signs are designed to show the way out while reminding people that the safest way to escape harmful smoke is by crawling.

The glow-in-the-dark sign idea came to Smallwood and his wife one night in 1980, shortly after hearing about a Las Vegas tragedy. "It was right after the MGM Grand burned" Smallwood said. That fire killed 84 people and injured more than 500. Many in the hotel had trouble finding exits. "We just kicked it around, back and forth, and came up with the idea at about the same time."

He formed Safex Inc. with his mother's financial help, and started working with graphics designers on two types of phosphorescent signs. One, for childrens' rooms, features the image of the "Baby Smurf" cartoon

character crawling away from a fire.



A fire safety program to accompany Smallwood's marketing plan emphasized placing the glow in the dark signs within 18 inches of the floor.

Insurance companies were very responsive to Smallwood's idea. Some insurance companies considered reduced fire rates for companies that put the signs in their buildings. Lowering rates compensated for the cost of buying and installing the phosphorescent signs.

Captain Jesse Sanches of the SAFD Fire Prevention Bureau said the department stresses smoke detectors for early warning. Sanchez took one of the Smurf signs with beveled edges home to show his 6 year old son, who quickly understood the message of crawling to the exit.

Safex Inc. secured exclusive rights to Smurf characters for the children's signs from Wallace Berrie Licensing of California

He maintains, as a trade secret the exact formula for the phosphorescent material which comes from Germany. It is neither toxic nor radioactive and will glow for eight hours.

Facts about the product:

All normal light sources activate it within a matter of 3 to 10 seconds.

A useful afterglow is effective for up to eight hours

Non-combustile up to 560F. Non- radioactive and non-toxic. Can be reactivated an unlimited number of times.

Baby Smurf Sign is made of high quality durable acrylic The sign is Blue and White and the dimensions are 5.7/8" by 7.7/8"
